## Western Star 12" Drop Visor Instructions



## Steps:

- 1) Remove your current visor:
  - a) You will need to reuse the bolts which go through brackets and ears into the cab (12 bolts).
  - b) Bolt Visor halves together. Make sure to use washers (provided) on both sides of halves when bolting together with center bracket in between.
- 2) Mount Wingmaster (provided) brackets to cab reusing bolts from step 1.
- 3) Attach Visor body to brackets.
  - a. Align the visor by snugly tightening one of the screws in each mounting bracket. Start from the outside of the cab and work toward the middle, one bolt per bracket at a time.
- 4) Align visor body to brackets as desired and tighten all bolts.
- 5) Remove the PVC coating from the visor.
